- (i) Function of Prospero's supernatural powers.
- (j) How many 'masks' does Volpone wear in his ambition for money and lechery?
- (k) Explain the title Volpone or The Fox.
- (l) Comment on Mosca's character in Volpone.
- 2. Discuss the gradual deterioration of Faustus's character and the prostitution of his powers after signing the bond with the Devil.
